
Protect your home from water damage

Inspect all water supply lines inside your home, and replace those that show signs of wear or that haven't been replaced in the last five years.




Clear your gutters so any obstructions like leaves, debris, or sticks won't clog your gutters and lead to an overflow.

If you have a sensor-based water leak dectection device, replace all the batteries in the sensor.




